

## INTRO TO BEADED JEWELRY PART 1 6 sessions Instructor: Marsha Davis (Marsha.Davis@92Y.org)

Please bring the following to all classes: Cloth for work surface (old pillow case, small sharp scissors, cloth measuring tape, small metal ruler marked in inches and in millimeters, and pencil & paper (or notebook) PLUS SUPPLIES NEEDED FOR THE PROJECTS, TO BE DISCUSSED IN FIRST CLASS.

DO NOT BUY ANYTHING IF YOU DO NOT ALREADY HAVE IT...JUST PILLOWCASE AND SCISSORS. PLEASE BUY AWL FROM INSTRUCTOR - BEST ONE (\$2.50)

Instructor will have for sale: beading awls, pearls, size 8 twisted wire needles, French wire and clasps, Beadalon fine collapsible eye needles, (cash only, please) may also have some additional supplies.

- 1. **KNOTTING PRACTICE** Beading awl, 1 strand of fresh water pearls 6mm to 10mm. Fine flex needles #6 or #8. **Note:** Pearls will used for practice knotting and will be cut apart and used again in Week 2. Silk will be provided by Instructor.
- 2. **KNOTTING FR WIRE AND PEARLS** Beading awl, **fresh water pearls used in Week** 1, and a clasp suitable for pearls. Clear nail polish and thick needle. <u>French wire in correct</u> size & silk will be provided by Instructor.
- 3 & 4. **TWO NEEDLE WEAVE NECKLACE** For 18" neck: 4mm glass beads: 40 beads & 6mm glass beads: 150 beads 1/2" Finished width. Spool nylon thread .335mm(F/4) or .4mm C-lon fine weight (Tex 35) Beadalon needles (fine), clasp and bead-tips to be discussed. Instructor will provide bead-tips.
- 5. **ELASTIC AND BEADING WIRE W/CRIMP BEADS** Assortment of glass beads for 18" Necklace. Single strand clasp. (Crimping tool, beading wire, and crimp beads if you have them.)

**For elastic bracelet** - 1 bead with really large hole, and apprx. 7" of other beads -4mm and up in size. 1mm or .7mm elastic. Beading awl and clear nail polish.

**6. EARRINGS ON STRING** Assortment of beads suitable for earrings. Nylon thread. Good Quality Ear wires if you have sensitive ears. Some thin nylon thread will be provided.



Exhaust fans must be turned on when torches are being used or any materials is being melted.

Tools & Torches are coded with six different colors which denote the studios they belong in and their use; Blue S353
Yellow S355
Red S352
