## Watercolor Painting: Intermediate/Advanced

## Supply list for Carla Aurich's class:

- Watercolor paint tubes Recommended: small tubes of artist grade Winsor-Newton, Holbein, Schminke or Old Holland. Please avoid colors called "tint" or "hue".
- Aurelian Yellow
- Lemon Yellow
- Cadmium yellow
- Alizarin crimson
- Cadmium red light \& medium
- Magenta
- Phalo or Viridian green
- Cerulean blue
- Ultramarine blue
- Raw umber
- Yellow ochre
- Burnt Sienna
- Paynes Grey
- Paper
- 140 lb . Cold Press -- 10" x14" (or thereabouts) watercolor block
- $11 \times 14$ and smaller blocks and pads (various sizes)
- Brushes, a variety of brushes (sable and nylon) Recommended brands: Winsor-Newton \& LoweCornell for sable/synthetic blends brushes
- round brushes \#10, \#8, \#4,
- flat wash brush $1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ or $1^{\prime \prime}$

Additional Items:

- Palette: porcelain or enameled metal are recommended, 10 wells/depressions with ample flat surface area for mixing colors.
- Plastic water container
- Sketch book
- Paper towels (Bounty)
- Small sponge
- Masking tape
- Pencil and eraser


## Supply List for Bonnie Steinsnyder's Class:

- Brushes: \#6 and \#10 rounds, 1 inch wash brush. Scepter Gold, Escoda Versatil, Princeton Aqua Elite and most of the mid-price good synthetics are ok. A cheap, stiff \#5 synthetic brush for lifting.
- Watercolor tubes- artist grade or small set. Recommended brands: Daniel Smith, Schminke, Holbein, Sennelier, Grumbacher, Rembrandt and Winsor Newton (*denotes colors from Winsor Newton) Cotman, Van Gogh and Grumbacher Academy (student grade) are ok. Do not use children's paint sets or Reeves; there is too much filler and not good pigment.


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- Essential colors:
- Winsor lemon yellow(cool)*
- Cadmium yellow medium(warm)
- Alizarin crimson permanent (cool)
- Winsor red (warm)*
- Pthalo Blue (cool) or Winsor blue red shade(cool)
- Ultramarine blue (warm)
- Winsor green - blue shade (cool)* or Pthalo green (cool)
- Hookers green (warm) or Sap green (warm)
- Burnt sienna
- Yellow ochre
- Burnt umber

Optional: Quinacridone magenta is a beautiful cool purple-pink, great for roses. Paynes Gray is useful. You don't need black or white paint

- A white plastic palette for laying out your tube colors and for mixing. Folding palettes close to about 5 "x10" if space is a problem. Covered palettes are easier to work with but take up more space.
- Paper:
- sketch pad for planning in pencil
- $9 " x 12 "$ pad of cold press, 140 lb . watercolor paper for experimenting with technique and testing color; Kilimanjaro, Montval are ok.
- $9 " 12^{\prime \prime}$ or $11^{\prime \prime} \times 14^{\prime \prime}$ block of Arches cold press, 140 lb . paper. This is a better paper and will give you better results.
Additional Items:
- plastic pint container for water
- paper towels (Bounty)
- $2 B$ and HB pencils
- kneaded eraser
- small real sponge
- masking tape
