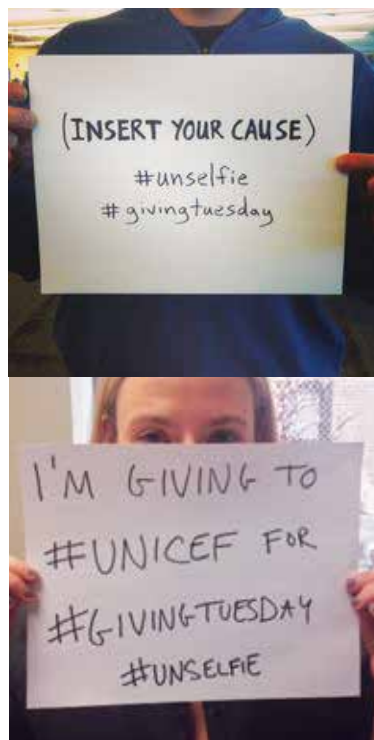

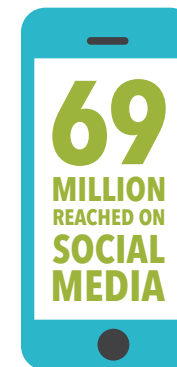

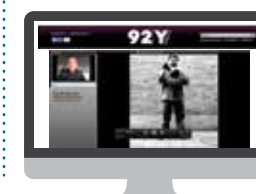

Traditional or post-denominational, deeply engaged or taking a break—no matter how people define themselves, we'll help them find a way to connect to Jewish culture, heritage and wisdom in a way that works for them. At the core of everything we do are Jewish values like learning and self-improvement, the importance of family, the joy of life, and giving back to our diverse and growing community both locally and around the world.

We offer a vibrant mix of Jewish learning opportunities for adults and children, multigenerational holiday celebrations, and programs where leading thinkers, cultural figures, artists and politicians provide a huge range of perspectives on everything from current events to ancient Jewish wisdom.

92Y Connect Jewish After-School

Instead of learning by rote, our after-school program sparks motivation and excitement for Judaism in our children. Our creative, individualized approach brings Jewish culture to life not only for the children in our program, but for their whole families, too—some of whom make their primary connection to their heritage through the program. What's next? A Connect Jewish After-School program for children with developmental disabilities is now in its pilot stage.

Innovation & Tradition

Through programs like Innovation & Tradition, run by Rabbi Dan Ain, millennials who have distanced themselves from organized worship are discovering how Judaism is relevant to young urban life. With Friday night dinners with guests like Colbert Nation's Father Jim Martin, Rabbi Ain is carving out a niche to teach Torah in today's world, without minimizing or detracting from the inherent power of the tradition.

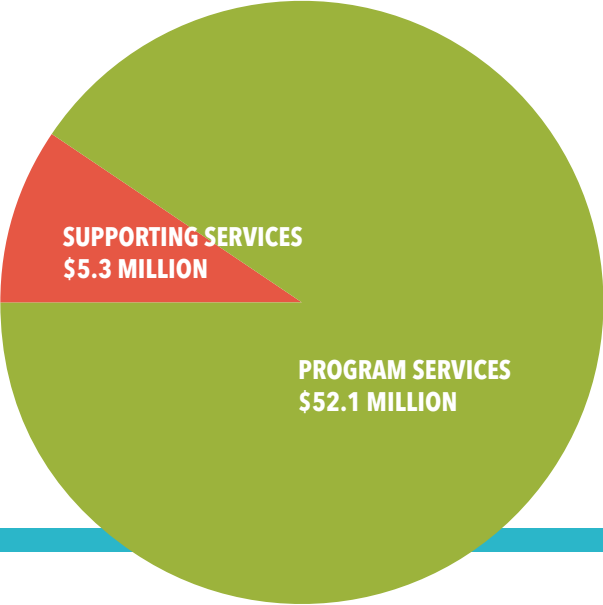
