A Message from the Director

Placing a dollar amount on the value of a membership in the Himan Brown Senior Program is, at best, difficult. We feel confident that most people place a high value on belonging to the program and consider it an important part of their retirement planning. We are committed to doing all we can to make your membership a worthwhile investment.

Based on your feedback, a decision was made to eliminate the longtime disparity between the cost of a couples' membership and an individual membership. As of September 1, we will have only individual memberships. Our fees, unchanged since 2006, will increase by approximately ten percent. A membership in the HBSP will be \$435 annually beginning Sept. 1, 2012. As always, we are available to help members for whom our fees represent a challenge. Scholarship assistance is available and we encourage anyone who feels the need, to apply for financial assistance or consider a payment plan. ■

CLASSES NEWS

Mario (Rio) Sussman, PhD. will teach **World Events** classes July 9-30. A retired Professor of Social and Organizational Psychology, his classes will address: "The Prisoner Dilemma Game", an experimental two-person game aimed at investigating the development of either cooperative or competitive hostile interaction between two parties; "A New Look at the Shoah"; "How Did Churchill Pick Stalin over Hitler?" and "The Dilemma Between Economic Growth and Saving the Environment". David Meyers teaches World Events beginning Aug 6 through 27 at 10:15 am.

Due to its overwhelming popularity, **Chess for Beginners** is moving to Room S256 from 11:15 am to 12:15 pm. Intermediate and advanced chess continue at 12:30 pm in the same room.

Roy Sheldon returns to teach **The 1800's - China's Pivotal Century**. Chinese language, pronunciation and historical background of Chinese characters and the evolution of "Putonghua" as the national language of China. The 1800's was a period of immense transition for China. There was cultural & military conflict with the West and Japan, a civil war lasting more than ten years, the rise of nationalism and efforts to reform China's institutions and customs to address a rapidly changing global environment. Study recent Supreme Court opinions and discuss and debate the legal rationale and future impact of these decisions in **David Meyer's Constitutional Law class**. Students will consider the current ideological divide of the current Supreme Court.
